**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RULES OF ORDER AND PROCEDURE
FOR THE PEA RIDGE CITY COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, the City Council needs to adopt published Rules of Order and Procedure for its meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the city of Pea Ridge, Arkansas:

Section 1: That the attached Rules of Order and Procedure are hereby adopted by the City Council for calendar year 2026.

Section 2: This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.

RULES OF ORDER AND PROCEDURE OF THE PEA RIDGE CITY COUNCIL

1. Regular Meetings

The City Council shall meet in regular session on the third Tuesday of each month at 6:00 P.M. The regular meeting time may be rescheduled by the City Council in special circumstances, but when so done the change must be made far enough in advance to allow normal public notification.

2. Location

The place of City Council meetings shall be in the City Council Chambers in City Hall.

3. Special Meetings

Special meetings may be called by three or more members of the City Council or by the Mayor. Notification of a special meeting, including specific items to be considered, shall be at least two hours prior to the meeting.

4. Executive Session

An executive session may be requested by any member of the City Council or the Mayor. A majority vote by the City Council is required to convene in executive session. Executive sessions will be permitted only for the purpose of considering the employment, appointment, promotion, demotion, disciplining, or resignation of any public officer or employee.

5. Committee of the Whole a.k.a. Work Session¹

Work session meetings may be called by three or more members of the City Council or by the Mayor. Notification of a work session, including specific items to be considered, shall be at least two hours prior to the meeting.

6. Quorum

A majority of the City Council shall be necessary to constitute a quorum to do business at a City Council meeting. The concurring vote of a majority of those attending a meeting shall be sufficient to pass procedural motions except a Motion to Suspend the Rules which requires four affirmative votes. Ordinances and Resolutions require four affirmative votes to pass.

7. Public Notification

The public shall be notified of all meetings in accordance with state law.

8. Voting

Ordinances shall require a roll call vote. Emergency clauses associated with ordinances shall require an undebatable separate roll call vote with a two-third majority approval. The City Clerk shall maintain a random roll call list of aldermen for each separate business item requiring a roll call vote.

Resolutions and all other motions of the Council may be approved by voice vote. A show of hands or roll call will be required on all non-unanimous votes to properly record the votes in the record.

¹ An informal meeting, generally called for the purpose of conducting an in-depth study on a limited number of topics. This type of meeting encourages exploration of subjects in more detail than is possible in regular council meetings because of time constraints and the pressure of other business.

9. Public Comment

Public comment is dedicated time for the public to speak to the City Council on topics that do not appear on the agenda. Speakers must identify themselves for the record and address the Council from the podium. Unrecognized comments from the audience are prohibited. Speakers recognized for comment will be limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. The total time dedicated to public comment should not exceed twenty (20) minutes at any single meeting, unless the City Council votes to extend the comment period by majority vote.

10. Agenda Items at City Council Meetings

Agenda items shall consist of all items of city business needing City Council approval, judgment or review arising out of the city budget, city departments, city council committees, city committees, boards, and commissions, and all city systems and processes submitted for the purpose of City Council action. Planning Commission items are automatically forwarded to the Mayor's Office for inclusion on the agenda.

The agenda is prepared by the Office of the Mayor. All agenda items for consideration at regular City Council meetings must be submitted to the Office of the Mayor by 4:00 PM no later than 12 days prior to the City Council meeting. Items may be included later with the Mayor's approval; however, the published agenda shall not include items submitted after 12:00 PM the Friday before the Tuesday City Council meeting. All items should be submitted electronically (if applicable) with all necessary documentation including ordinances and/or resolutions.

- a. Discussion of Agenda Items.** Debate on agenda items appearing before the City Council is reserved for the City Council. Public comment on agenda items at a City Council meeting may be allowed in specific situations for members of the audience when recognized by the Mayor. Speakers must identify themselves for the record and address the Council from the podium. Unrecognized comments from the audience are prohibited. Speakers recognized for comment will be limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes.

- b. Items Tabled Indefinitely**

Any agenda item tabled indefinitely may be taken from the table by majority vote of the City Council during the calendar year in which it was tabled indefinitely. All items tabled indefinitely and remaining on the table at the end of the calendar year shall be deemed denied and rejected for all purposes on December 31st and shall not be considered by the City Council in the future unless brought forward as a new item.

11. Virtual City Council Meetings Authorized




